Museum of Arts & Sciences (MOAS) Hosts Education Program with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and Mobile Radar (Doppler-on-Wheels)

Date Changed to Sunday, May 17th 12pm-3pm

Daytona Beach, FL (May xx, 2015) - The date for the educational program by the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU) Meteorology students has been changed to Sunday, May 17th from noon until 3:00 p.m.. The program will still feature the Mobile Radar Doppler-on-Wheels truck.

The Doppler-on-Wheels truck will be located in the circle in front of the main lobby at the Museum of Arts & Sciences. ERAU Meteorology students and faculty will be on hand to discuss the meteorology program, field research and central Florida thunderstorms. This complimentary program will allow visitors the opportunity to tour the DOW to see the equipment, how it works and even take a few sample scans. Other instruments including a tornado POD and hand-held pressure/wind/temperature sensors will also be available. The program will be weather permitting with a make-up day schedule for Sunday, May 17th from noon to 3:00 p.m. in the event that the program is cancelled due to weather.

The educational outreach program by ERAU at the Museum of Arts & Sciences is part of an 18-day Doppler-on-Wheels (DOW) summer field course and experiment that will be conducted by students in the Meteorology Program at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. The project begins May 4th through May 21st and is designed to further the education of undergraduate meteorology students at ERAU by incorporating the Doppler-on-Wheels into a summer course that provides real-world experience with the latest radar technology, field work, and data analysis. The project will also utilize collected radar data to undertake a detailed modern scientific analysis of sea-breeze processes and thunderstorms in central Florida. Students in the program will participate in outreach programs to expose local K-12 students and the general public to Doppler technology and atmospheric research.

Museum of Arts & Sciences admission is \$12.95 adults; \$6.95 children 6-17; \$10.95 seniors and students; members and children 5 and under are free. Daily Planetarium shows and weekly laser shows. Museum of Arts & Sciences admission includes one Planetarium show. Cici and Hyatt Brown Museum of Art admission is \$10.95 adults; \$4.95 children 6-17; \$8.95 seniors and students; members and children 5 and under are free. Combo ticket admission is \$18.95 adults; \$9.95 children 6-17; \$16.95 seniors and students; members and children 5 and under are free. Combo ticket admission includes on Planetarium show. Additional Planetarium shows are \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for children ages 17 and under. Parking is free. Admission is FREE for Volusia County residents the first Tuesday of each month (does not include Planetarium shows). MOAS is fully accessible to the handicapped. MOAS is located at 352 S.
